SHS Band Boosters:

March Meeting was called to order by President Vicki Shadel on Monday 11th March at 7:01pm.

Student Band President Leah Robin's report: A lot has happened recently... We had the Orchestra concerto concert last week, band member Narin Kim was one of the highlighted soloists and then the Honor Band field trip with an incredible performance experience.
