CONCERTOPOLIS: With Marching Band season on the books, during the next three months you can expect your student musicians to be performing in a number of Pep Band dates for basketball and about six concerts spanning both classical and jazz. Please give a hearty round of applause to those student musicians who participated in the ILMEA festivals this month. Mr. Inendino circulated the list last month. Be proud if you have a student on that list because they earned it, and you no doubt encouraged it. December kicks the concert season into high gear with the **Holiday Showcase** (Concert & Raffle) on Wednesday and Thursday, **December 8-9**. *If you'd still like to donate to the cause for the raffle, there's still time!* The next day, Friday, **December 10**, marks the first **Pep Band Night** – a double-header basketball game! Pep Band during basketball season represents five games over four nights throughout the winter.

Once the calendar year rolls over, we start 2022 with the **Mark Colby Jazz Invitational** on **January 22** at Harper College. **The Pep Band Concert**, originally scheduled for January 18, has been rescheduled for **January 26**. The **ILMEA State Conference** in Peoria is scheduled for **January 27-29**. After that we have the **SHS/D54 Band-O-Rama** (that includes a Dairy Queen Blizzard sale) on **February 7**, followed by **D211 Honors Orchestra** at Palatine High School on **February 12**. The winter concert season draws to a close on **February 26** with **Jazz in the Meadows** at Rolling Meadows High School, followed by the **Jazz 'n Joe Coffeehouse** at SHS on **March 1**.

DINE2DONATE: We hope you've enjoyed our first five Dine2Donate events so far. We schedule these fundraising opportunities on the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month (except for December, January and March). We encourage Band families to purchase meals at selected Dine2Donate restaurants. Those restaurants then donate a percentage of the proceeds back to SHS Band to support products and services not covered by the school or D211. With five in the tank, we now have 12 remaining!
